So the prime need is the unity of the workers to combat the tactics and strategy of the top ten. All our compatriots should be advised and campaigned to join the trade unions. Though there are many weaknesses in the trade union movement, but T.U. is the pivot of the workers. Our members should not only join but must go to the meetings, take active part, put forward their problems and ask for the solutions.


The second most important work is the formation of racial solidarity or racial equality organisations to defeat the growing tension, prejudice and deterioration of race relations among the workers. The Labour and Tories are kneeling before racial propaganda and the general direction of race relation is also not a happy one. It is Hitlerite trick, first to isolate the coloured people and then strangle the general working class movement. We should struggle hard to defeat the dividing tricks of racialists and neo-fascists. Racialism - white or black is an anathema for the working class solidarity and betterment. To combat and safeguard the interests of the coloured people in particular (against racialism) and to create harmony among all workers, we must rally the forces and individuals immediately in our respective towns. There are many local organisations (based on nationalities), political groups, parties and individuals who are keen and eager to fight racialism. Approach all the people irrespective of colour, race, sex or nationality, and ask them to help in setting up inter-racial bodies. Representatives and individuals be called in a meeting initiated by you, explain the general situation and seek their support for such organisations. There are individuals in colleges, schools, universities, trade unions, in the labour, liberal parties, young liberals, C.P.G.B., young communists plus nationality organisations and also ask religious bodies to support this move.

Let me conclude the essence of what I wish to convey. We must enlist the support of any body and everybody whosoever is prepared to stand and march with us to improve race relations, strengthening the working class solidarity and create equality.
